## Check Out Our **NEW** Online Lending Library System!

Huffer Child Care Resource and Referral has launched a new web-based Lending Library System. This library was developed to support child care professionals in their work with children and families.

The library offers developmentally appropriate activities by providing books for infants through school-age children, curriculum, theme kits, resource books (child activities, discipline, special needs, business resources), videos and so much more!

Once you are enrolled, you will have access to the online Lending Library portal where you can search through hundreds of resources that are available for you to check out and use in your program.

For a \$2 enrollment charge, you will be given access to the Lending Library Online System and the ability to check-out numerous items for use in your program. At one time, you can check-out : 1 large kit, 1 small kit, 5 resource books, 1 CD/Cassette, 2 puzzles, and 5 children's books. You may choose from 3 categories above for each check-out. Items may be checked-out for 30 days then must be renewed. Some of the items include:

- Manipulatives
- Children's Books
- Gross Motor Items (Parachutes, etc.)

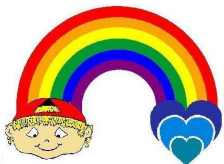

## About Huffer CCR&R

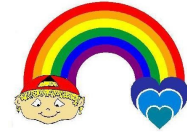
Huffer Memorial Children's Center, Child Care Resource and Referral (CCR&R) is one of eleven child care resource and referral agencies in the state of Indiana.

## Severe Weather Cancellation Policy

Hazardous weather conditions may cause some trainings or Paths to Quality visits to be canceled on short notice. This policy provides some guidelines to follow for what to do in case bad weather or hazardous road conditions come into effect.

If the local school system of the location of training/visit is canceled, the training will be canceled. If there are hazardous driving conditions as stated by the Indiana State Police, such as ice, the training/visit will be canceled.

Due to travel of our trainers/mentors, roads may or may not be hazardous at the destination of the training or visit or starting point of the trainer or mentor; in which travel routes will be closely monitored by the training/mentor team and if hazardous conditions are present, the trainings/visit will be canceled.

Trainers/mentors will try to contact all participants via phone using the number that is provided at time of registration. Please provide CCR&R with the best number to contact you. Trainers/mentors will print off the most recent registration information to take with them in case calls need to be made. Trainers or mentors will contact the Education Coordinator for cancellation and the Education Coordinator will contact the location of the training with cancellation information.

Huffer CCR&R will make the best effort to contact local TV and/or radio stations of cancellation of trainings.

## **Quality Improvement Grants Awarded**

Last fall, Huffer CCR&R was selected by the **Ball Brothers Foundation** to award grants to child care providers interested in increasing their level of quality.

Recipients were:

- Myra Hisle – Union County; \$1,400; opening licensed home
- New Beginnings Ministry - Hancock County; \$2,300; structural upgrades to meet VCP requirements
- Ford Street Ministry—Madison County – needs structural upgrades - \$15,000, playground equipment
- YMCA Chenoweth Ministry – Randolph County; \$7,900; structural upgrades & curriculum

We thank all the programs that applied. We hope to offer more opportunities like this in the future!

## **Interested In Starting A Child Care Program?**

License Orientation is for those interested in becoming a licensed home/center or an unlicensed registered ministry. Call to register for Orientation Training (OT 1), Start-up Workshop for Homes, Centers and Ministries, to learn about health, safety, and start-up requirements plus information on the different types of child care programs in Indiana. You will need to attend OT 2 after attending OT 1. If you are opening a center or registered ministry you will need to attend OT 2 in Indianapolis. These trainings are strongly encouraged, but not required for ministries.

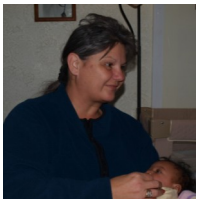

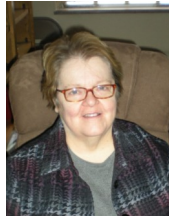

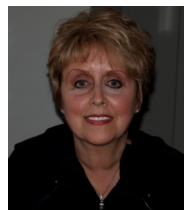

## ATTENTION: Paths to QUALITY Providers

In recognition of your commitment and hard work, we will be providing marketing and recognition of your program in the CCR&R newsletters and in other media releases, such as newspaper articles and advertisements, posters, etc. **Paths to QUALITY** levels are included in child care referrals and families are also given information about the **Paths to QUALITY** program.

## How can Paths to QUALITY help my program?

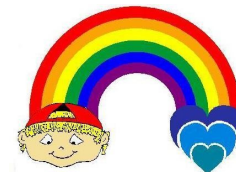
- ✦ Providers who enroll in Paths to QUALITY will be eligible to participate in specialized mentoring relationships with Huffer CCR&R. Through a technical assistance process, the mentor will help the provider work to achieve Levels 2 and 3. Providers also have the option of choosing self-guided study.
- ✦ All providers who enroll in the Paths to QUALITY system will receive a *Participation Incentive*. Provider will be mailed this incentive package within 7 to 10 days of signing the Paths to QUALITY agreement form.
- ✦ Enrolled providers who successfully complete Levels 2 and 3 are eligible for one time *non-cash Recognition Awards* upon attainment of each level.
- ✦ Providers who achieve Level 3 and desire to move on to Level 4, which includes becoming accredited by an approved national accrediting body, will be eligible for *financial support* and technical assistance. The amount of financial support is based on need and the number of children enrolled in a program. Support is available to assist with the accrediting process, the validation/endorsement phase, and/or equipment needed to meet the accreditation criteria.
- ✦ After completing the standards for Level 4, providers are eligible for a special one time *cash Recognition Award* to recognize their achievement of the highest level of quality.
- ✦ An *Annual Level 4 Accreditation Maintenance Award* will be given to providers who annually maintain the standards for Level 4 as well as accreditation from an approved accrediting body. Additionally, a provider who achieves and maintains accreditation through an approved accrediting body is eligible, on an ongoing basis, to receive a 10% higher reimbursement rate through the Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF) Voucher Program.

Overall, participation in Paths to QUALITY will give Indiana providers better access to knowledge, information, assistance, materials and general support to help them provide higher quality child care experiences for young children.

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT TRAININGS at Huffer CCR&R

Huffer CCR&R has begun using a training tracking system called TTAM. This system allows CCR&R to quickly and easily track provider trainings, certifications and qualifications by individual employees, locations or programs. As we continue tracking this information, we will be able to provide individuals with a detailed transcript of all trainings attended.

This new system requires us to gather personal information from training attendees. Some of the required information will include Date of Birth, and the last five (5) digits of an individual's Social Security Number. These two pieces of information allow us to create a unique user ID number. All information submitted to Huffer CCR&R is confidential and we do not sell or share any of our provider's information.

When you attend a CCR&R training, you will be asked to fill out a form to get your information started in the TTAM system.

You can also fill out the form on the next page and send it back to Huffer CCR&R.

## IMPORTANT CRIB RECALL INFORMATION!!!

*Important Message from Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC):*

- CPSC reminds parents not to use any crib with missing, broken, or loose parts. Make sure to tighten hardware from time to time to keep the crib sturdy. When using a drop-side crib, parents should check to make sure the drop side or any other moving part operates smoothly.
- Always check all sides and corners of the crib for disengagement. Disengagements can create a gap and entrap a child. In addition, do not try to repair any side of the crib. Babies have died in cribs where repairs were attempted by caregivers.
- If your baby is less than six months old and is not yet able to push up to his/her hands and knees, you can put your baby to sleep in a bassinet. Make sure your bassinet has not been recalled\*. Also, you can use a play yard.
- DO NOT put additional bedding such as pillows, thick quilts, comforters or anything plush into your baby's sleeping space. More babies die every year from suffocation in plush sleeping environments than from defective cribs.

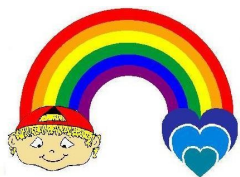
